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How does Live-in Care help?

Live-in Care is a lifeline to people who come to find they need support but wish to remain in the comfort of their own home and live as independently as possible. People often consider care homes because Live-in Care is often unheard of, assumed to be more expensive or considered to be for people who need 'complex' care.

Although we do care for individuals who need 'complex care' such as PEG feeding, or wheelchair transfers, we also care for individuals who need a little help around the house such as getting up and down the stairs and cooking meals. In comparison to care homes, research is continuing to prove that Live-in Care is a better alternative. Research shows that consistent and familiar routines help manage the symptoms of a wide range of conditions from rehabilitation after injury to dementia.

Will I have a different Carer every day?

With Live-in Care, you will have the same familiar Carer every day for as long as you and your Care Co-ordinator have arranged. Unlike hourly Carers and care homes, Live-in Care provides consistent care from a familiar face for six to eight weeks or even longer.

Our Carers are typically available at home for up to eight hours daily and up to twelve weeks at a time. But this can be longer. Our care service isn't restrictive as we understand and work with so many different people. Why not arrange a care assessment in your home, free of charge. Here, you can go over the details that are unique to you.

What level of care will I receive?

The level of care usually depends upon the initial plan of care but typically include:

Day to day

- Meal planning and cooking
- Light housework, shopping and gardening
- Pet care

Assistance with Medication

- Coordinating care with GPs, District Nurses and other Healthcare professionals
- Continence support and catheter care
- Monitoring of blood pressure, blood sugar, etc
- Pressure care and support with wound management
- Assistance with Medication management/administration
- Personal care
- Washing and dressing
- Grooming such as make-up or shaving
- Nail care (Filing)

Emotional support

- Companionship
- Assistance to attend social clubs or events
- Support in communicating with friends and family

Complex Care

- Nurse-led service with over 25 years experience
- Management of complex conditions including Bowel Care, Diabetes, Dementia, Epilepsy, PEG and Tracheostomy
